

It depends on when you will reach Hong Kong. If it is day time, after you check in the hotel in Tsim Sha Tsui, you can walk along the waterfront all the way to the Hung Hom region. From there you can visit the Polytechnic University and Hong Kong Coliseum. The PU is a building complex of red bricks and HKC is a building like an inverted pyramid. You can stay in that region known as East Tsim Sha Tsui until night. It is a commercial region with lots of entertainment settings at the basement floor. At least 4 to 5 big night clubs are located in this region. Of course, it is kind of expensive because pretty girls are provided to dance with you. There are also cinemas, restaurants, diners in these region. Once it is getting dark, you can enjoy looking at the beautiful night scenes of Victoria Harbor and the colorful light decorations outside the hotels. There are more than 40 hotels in Tsim Sha Tsui, in which you will see at least 30 pretty designed Christmas related light bulbs pictures on the outside walls of them. Take a good sleep to prepare for the long trip of next day.

Day 2: (Full day) You should wake up early because the schedule is tight today. Take a ferry to Lantau Island, there is a temple called Po Lin Temple. There sits a huge Buddha status on the top of a hill. It is supposed to be the biggest sitting-budda in the world. There is a village called Tai O at the western coast of Lantau Island where you will find typical life style of Boat People. I suggest you visit Stanley when you go back to Hong Kong Island from Lantau Island where you can shop and enjoy cafeteria near the beach. After that, you should visit Causeway Bay, the biggest shopping area of Hong Kong Island (just like Time Square of NY) and go in any restaurant you like to take a specialized dinner. If time is available, take a tram to the Peak to look at the night scenes of Kowloon as a whole, where you may be able to see the room of your hotel. If you prefer dancing, there is a place in Central District known as Lan Kwai Fong. There are 30 to 40 puffs and bars within a short and narrow street. Many westernized people enjoy spending time there until 3 or 4 am in the morning.

Day 3: (Full day) You should concentrate on Kowloon Side. There are Space Museum, Art Museum and Science Museum very closed to New World Hotel of Tsim Sha Tsui. Take a quick look, at least to their front door, to take a few photos. You can walk along Nathan Road all the way northward. You will find lots of tourist oriented shops. Be careful of being cheated by those electrical stores. You will come across Kowloon Park where you can spend an hour inside (like Central Park of NY). Keep on walking will bring you to a place called Mongkok. It is the busiest region of Kowloon. If you need cheap stuffs, there is a street full of stalls named Women's Street. From the name you can know there are enough of women's stuffs. Beware of pickpockets since it should be very crowded. Take a late lunch in any of the extensive choices of restaurants. If you need sports stuffs, there is a region full of more than 100 sports stores. You should compare the prices before make up your mind. After shopping in Mongkok, you can walk back to Tsim Sha Tsui direction along Nathan Road or Shanghai Street. If time is not available, go into subway and get off at Yau Ma Tei station. You can find also cheap stuff in a region called Men's Street. Don't be scared by the pornographic video, books and women waiting for their customers. It is safe enough if you don't go to a dark corner. You will find delicious and cheap dinner food over there. Keep on walking to Tsim Sha Tsui until you find a street called Cameron

Road. It is a street full of cheap exported fashion stores for women or girls. There are also adult night club along Nathan Road of this region. You won't miss them.

Day 4: (Full day) You have a couple of choices:

Chinese University in Shatin, ie. the University I studied. You will see pretty view of water and mountains. – Half day.

University of Science and Technology in Sai Kung, ie. a luxury “Ross Royce” university. It is the latest and most expensive university of Hong Kong ever. I have no chance to be there. – half day.

Cheung Chau, ie. an island where have no vehicles but quiet life and beautiful beach. The sea food is very famous. – half day. You can visit Causeway Bay or Central District again since the pier of ferry is located at Central District.

Lok Ma Chau, ie. a place you can see the border between Hong Kong and China. You can also visit many traditional Chinese agricultural customs in a closed region known as Kam Tin. – Full day.

Day 5: You should prepare the transportation to the Airport. I forgot when should you be in the airport. If it is around 1pm, you may have nothing to do except a good breakfast with your son in the hotel. The city hasn't been waken up until 10 or 11am.
